






## DIRECTOR AMY TUCKER

## ED MANAGEMENT OF PLACENTAL ABRUPTION

Placental abruption, or Abruptio placentae, is a condition in which the placenta separates from the uterine wall prior to birth of the fetus, disrupting maternal-fetal circulation. This condition is most common in the second and third trimesters, when the placenta loses elasticity. While there are many causes to placental abruption (smoking, high parity, drug use, etc.), blunt force trauma, pelvic fractures, and acceleration/deceleration forces are especially high risks. Placental abruption is the second most common cause of fetal death in the pregnant patient (Stevenson, 2023).

Because ultrasound has poor sensitivity for diagnosing placental abruption, a CT should be considered for confirmation (Qiu et al., 2021).



#### FOR MOM:

- Partner with L&D to run TOCO strips early.
- Consult OB early
- If maternal shock present, blood products and TXA
- Postpartum, uterotonics such as Pitocin, Methergine, or Hemabate
- DIC treatment such as cryoprecipitate, if applicable

#### SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

- Dark red vaginal bleeding (unless concealed)
- Abdomen/back pain
- Uterine irritability/rigidity
- Maternal shock
- Fetal distress (i.e. HR <110 or >160)
- Rising fundal height
- DIC (could present up to 48 hrs after)

#### **FOR BABY**

If fetal life is present, an emergency C-section would be indicated. Ensure that OB and a neonatologist are consulted early. Surgery would ideally be in the OR. Ensure neonatal resuscitation equipment is on hand.


